2. Care beyond chemo.

Cancer patients need more than chemotherapy, they need support for all aspects of treatment. We provide all types of oncology therapies including chemotherapy, biologic therapy, targeted therapy and immunotherapy. But our plans go further than just a drug choice. Our care management program expands our reach outside the physical walls of our office. Our specialized oncology care nurses assist patients with managing symptoms, providing nutritional guidance, social work support and financial counseling. We believe in treating the whole patient.

According to a 2016 Milliman study¹, patients who had their chemotherapy treatment delivered entirely in a hospital outpatient setting incurred between 34 and 42 percent higher costs than patients receiving identical chemotherapy in a community-based practice like ours. We believe that controlling costs while delivering cutting-edge treatments is paramount to ensuring best possible outcomes while reducing financial burdens.

4. Convenient locations.

Cancer patients need to be close to family, friends, and faith communities, and be able to continue with their daily lives. Our clinics are in convenient locations, with physicians and other providers, in-house laboratory, pathology, infusion and pharmacy services all under one roof.

5. Research.
